DEAR CRUSADER FAMILY,

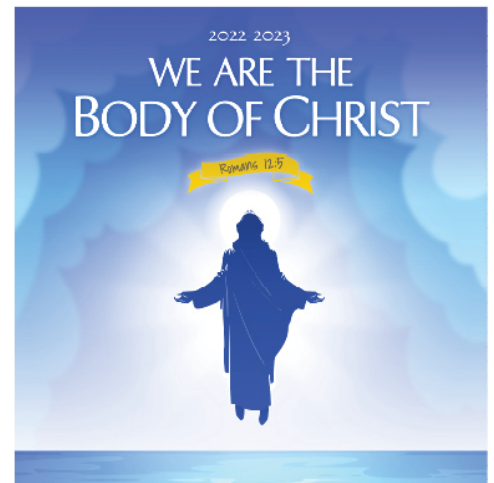

IN THIS ISSUE

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FRONT COVER — Pensacola Catholic High School is very proud of the nine Senior students honored as National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists and Commended Students. As seen on this publication's cover photo - Lexi Foland, Porter Hanley, Luke Junck, Elizabeth Owens, Sophia Royles, and Tyler Ruble were named Semifinalists in the 2023 National Merit Scholarship Competition and Virginia Myers, Jacob Seaman, and Caroline Struck were selected as Commended Students. Catholic High has had Semifinalist and Commended Students in the past, but never this many in one year. This year marks the 68th annual National Merit Scholarship Program with over 16,000 Semifinalists and 34,000 Commended Students were honored. Students earned these designations by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) in the Fall of 2021. The nationwide pool of Semifinalists represents less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors and includes the highest-scoring entrants in each state. The number of Semifinalists in a state is proportional to the state's percentage of the national total of graduating seniors. These academically talented high school seniors have an opportunity to continue in the competition to earn one of the 7,250 National Merit Scholarships worth a total of nearly \$28 M that will be offered in the Spring of 2023. To be considered and named a Finalist, the Semifinalist and a high school official must submit a detailed scholarship application, in which they provide information about the Semifinalist's academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. Commended Students are the "runner up" in this process and will not participate in the scholarship process, but will receive a Letter of Commendation for the scores they earned. Tyler Ruble, one of our Semifinalists, scored a perfect score on the PSAT/NMSQT, the National qualifying exam. On a separate but similar note, three CHS students earned a perfect score on the ACT test -- Lexi Foland, Sophia Royles, and Tyler Ruble. When Lexi Foland was asked, "Why do you think you did so well on these tests?", she credited all of the teachers for the education she has received as well as the Test Preparation Course that is offered to students in the Honors Program in their Junior year. She said, "That course helped me understand what to expect going into the test and the best strategy for approaching the test. Yes, the curriculum I was taught in my core classes was pivotal, but the Test Prep course helped me to not be nervous".

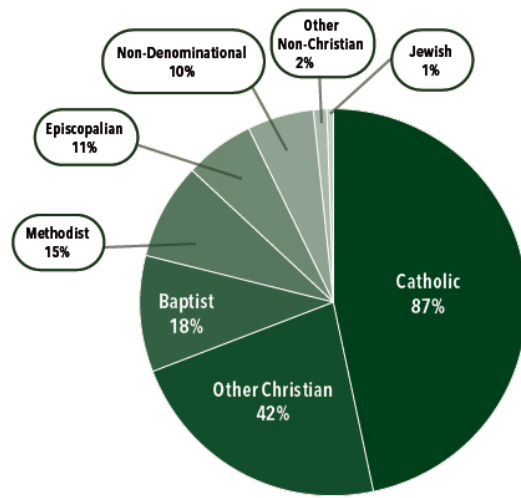

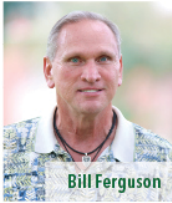


NEW FACULTY

CHS CLASS OF 1958 PASSES ON A PIECE OF HISTORY

Recently, members of the Class of 1958 visited campus to officially hand over a piece of Catholic High history – a scale model of the original Pensacola Catholic High School that was located on the corner of Garden and Baylen Streets in Downtown Pensacola. Catholic High was located there beginning in 1941 when Bishop Thomas J. Toolen centralized all Catholic secondary education in Pensacola. Not much is known about the origin of the model – Who made it? How old is it? Was there a purpose for the model? Here is what we do know -- When "The Class of CHS", which they affectionately like to call themselves, was planning their 30th class reunion in 1988, they acquired the model from Fr. John Licari, their former Religion Teacher. (Fr. John Licari from St. John's would like you all to know this was not him, it was his uncle.) For the next 34 years, the model was used during class reunions and get-togethers to help classmates remember "the good 'ole days". Classmates took turns being the custodian of the model between events. The Class of 1958 is the last class to graduate from the "original" Catholic High School, after spending all four years there. Their Junior classmates that year started in the Fall of 1958 as Seniors at the "new" Catholic High located on West Scott Street. The 1958 classmates remember referring to the new school as being "out in the boonies" as West Scott Street was still a clay dirt road. After a recent get-together, the Class decided that it was now time to pass the model on to Catholic High, and on September 2 Sister Kierstin Martin, other members of CHS Administration, and Juliet Messerly, Student Council Secretary, graciously accepted the gift on behalf of Catholic High.

28TH MAKE A DIFFERENCE DAY

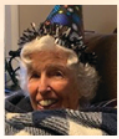

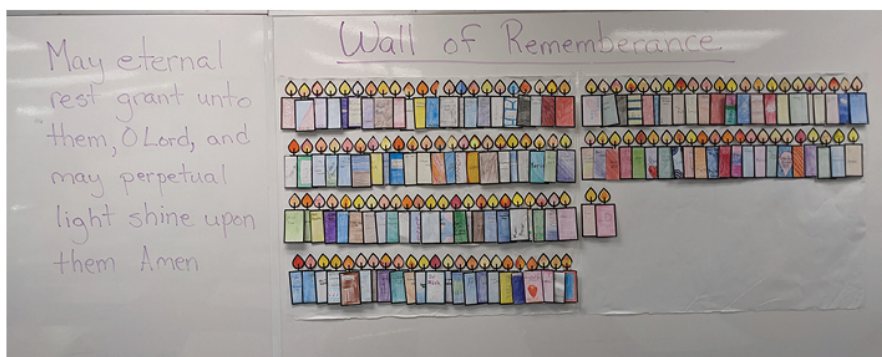

They then hung the candles up in the classroom and remembered them in our daily prayers throughout the month of November.

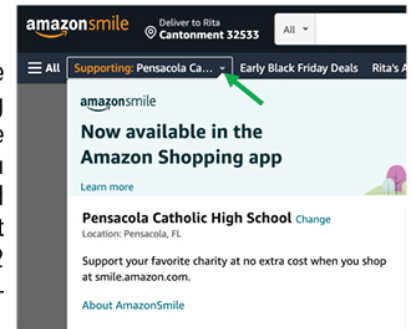

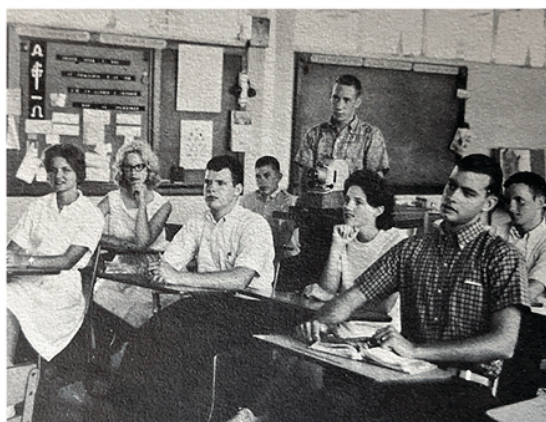
CLASS OF 1972 CELEBRATES 50 YEARS

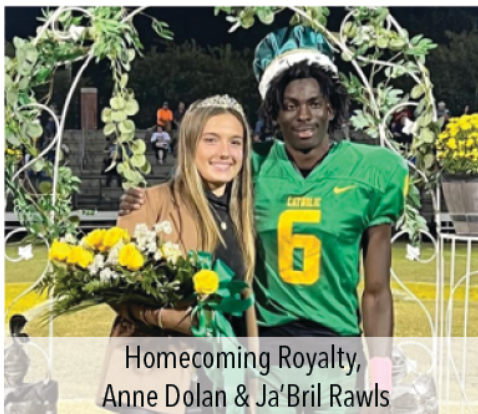
